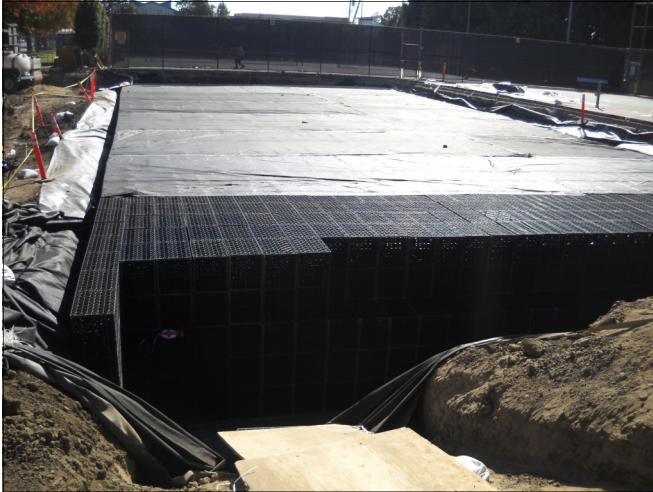


ECO-RAIN TANK SYSTEMS OF AMERICA CASE STUDY

STREET RUNOFF

Mar Vista Surge Tank Los Angeles CA

Mar Vista now has a BMP system that will reduce pollutant loading in storm water runoff diverted from an existing 78" storm drain in the adjacent Sawtelle Blvd. Currently treated water is diverted back to the storm drain. The water is being monitored for up to one year. After testing, if the water is safe, they hope to use it to irrigate Mar Vista Park.



- Installed July 2009
- The system includes the following "treatment train":
 - Diversion Structure
 - Trash Maintenance Hole
 - Influent Pump Station
 - CDS Hydrodynamic Separator
 - 34,000 Cubic Feet Underground EcoRain® Detention Tank
 - 7' deep x 47' wide x 108' long
 - Chlorination/Dechlorination System
